

Dr. M. Kathleen THOMAS is an Associate Professor of Economics at <u>Mississippi State University</u> who specializes in public finance and education policy. Prior to joining the faculty at MSU, Dr. Thomas was a researcher with the <u>Texas Schools Project</u> at The University of Texas at Dallas. Dr. Thomas maintains her affiliation with the Texas Schools Project and is currently using longitudinal student-level education data to examine access to arts education and how arts participation influences education outcomes using quasi-experimental techniques. Her current research is funded by the Spencer Foundation and the National Endowment for the Arts. Dr. Thomas' research has been published in numerous peer reviewed journals including Economics Letters, Southern Economic Journal, and Journal of Cultural Economics. Dr. Thomas earned her Ph.D. in economics from Georgia State University in 2000.
